Cui Zi'en is a director, film scholar, screenwriter, novelist, and outspoken queer activist and scholar based in Beijing. He earned an MA in literature from the Chinese Academy of Social Science and serves as an assistant research fellow at the Film Research Institute of the Beijing Film Academy. He has published nine novels in China and Hong Kong, one of which, *Uncle's Past*, won the 2001 Radio Literature Award in Germany. He is also the author of six books on criticism and theory and writes columns for four magazines. In 2002, Cui Zi'en received a Felipa Award from the International Gay and Lesbian Human Rights Commission and a California State Assembly Award in the United States. Frequently referred to as a "queer auteur," Cui Zi'en is also one of the most avant-garde digital-video (DV) makers in Chinese underground cinema. His major films include the internationally renowned titles *Enter the Clown* (2002) and *The Old Testament* (2002).
